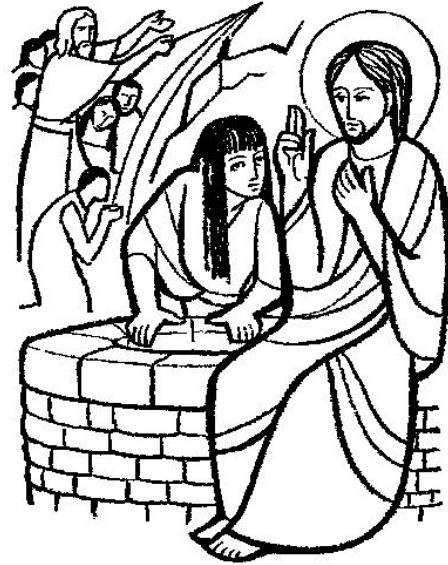

The identity of Jesus unfolds in the conversation of one who is thirsty enough.



LET'S TALK

We probably all have a friend like this: the one who says, "Let's talk"—and promptly proceeds to do all the talking. It's tough to have a one-sided conversation. The root word means both to associate with and to turn around. Conversing implies getting together and passing the talking stick from one to the next. Genuine conversation is also a far cry from chitchat. As the point of view revolves around, ideas grow and change. Information is shared and increased. New awareness becomes available to all in a spiral of ascent.

Jesus has such a conversation with the Samaritan woman. Such conversations are rarely recorded in the gospels. When Jesus is recruiting followers, he doesn't waste words: "Come," he says, and they either do or don't. When he teaches the crowds, there's no dialogue. When other rabbis come to him with trick questions, few are hankering for a true sharing of ideas. The rarely noted conversations are between Jesus and his faithful disciples. After a public teaching, Jesus retreats with his friends, answers their questions, and explores the deeper meanings of what he's been saying and doing. He'll even suggest what they can expect next.

The gospels don't present these conversations in much detail. We're often merely told that Jesus goes aside with his friends; the rest happens offstage. A few times in John's account, however, a longer conversation goes on the record. In this way, we learn what passes between Jesus and the 12 apostles at the Last Supper; how Pilate treats Jesus like an equal statesman during the trial; and how an isolated woman from outside the Jewish community rises in recognition of who Jesus is.

The nature of conversation suggests that an advancement of understanding is the purpose of these extended exchanges. At the Last Supper, Jesus tells his friends frankly what's up ahead, and answers any questions they have about this startling information. Yet this conversation is rather a dismal failure. Judas betrays his teacher nonetheless. Peter falls prey to the denial foretold. Thomas forgets that Jesus is preparing a place for him the moment the stone is rolled against the tomb. Everyone heard. But no one listened.

The recorded conversation with Pilate is clipped and spare. Pilate asks questions, but belittles each response. In the end and against his better judgment, Pilate makes a ruling that takes nothing he's heard into account. In the gospels, only with the Samaritan woman does genuine conversation take place. She alone, this nameless woman, ascends in understanding as a result of thoughtful time spent with Jesus. Information turns to revelation, and new life comes to many—all because one woman was willing to talk. In this generation, where are the real conversations happening, and how can we be part of them?

AWAKE, O SLEEPER

There's something wonderful about the "aha" moment. Maybe it comes as you strain over a crossword puzzle and the elusive word suddenly rises in you. Or you're watching a whodunit, and the culprit dawns on you in a flash of intuition. Perhaps you've been trying to remember a name from long ago, and hours later, it pops into your brain like a submersible breaking surface at last.

These are everyday examples of insight; literally the clarity received from an inner light. Weightier insights occur as we seek solutions to grave problems. Financial solvency arrives as harrowing numbers fall into place and a deficit is resolved. The intractable relationship issue that seemed to lead toward separation finds a surprising route to reconciliation. In the sacred moment of invention, a cure is discovered, ecological disaster averted. In these ways and more, we move from an uncertain and terrifying blindness into the light of hope.

Saint Paul describes how spiritual darkness is resolved when we ourselves become "light in the Lord." Christ-light doesn't shine down from above like a search beam on a moonless landscape. It rises up from within, something we in turn reveal as we embrace the commission to be this light. As our blindness is cured in the encounter with Jesus, we must "live as children of the light," producing goodness and truth for others still trapped in the dark. Christ-light isn't for the keeping; it's no light under a bushel basket. It's for sharing and spreading around.

Yet many of us focus on the dark aspects of our generation and fail to place the emphasis on the duty to be light and to bring light. Frankly, it's easier to do. We're like the disciples, trying to parse out why a man they pass on the street was born blind. Was it something his parents did? Surely he wasn't punished in the womb for future wrongdoing, blinded by pre-crime, as it were. What's the nature of this sin, and who's at fault?

We enter lively debates about why people are hungry, unemployed, homeless, in debt, in jail, at war. While it's important to understand the causes behind the conditions, and to create more just structures where necessary, it's also a matter of justice to assist the individuals suffering right now. The disciples were content to turn the man born blind into an object lesson on sin. Jesus saw a man without sight and relieved his condition.

The religious leaders see the miraculously sighted man and try to turn him once more into a conduit of sin. Happily, a person who sees can't be fooled by the blindness of others. Sin leaves us in the dark. In Christ, truth is easy to see.

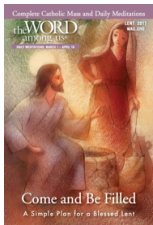
