**What is a Synod?** (pronounced sin-uh d)

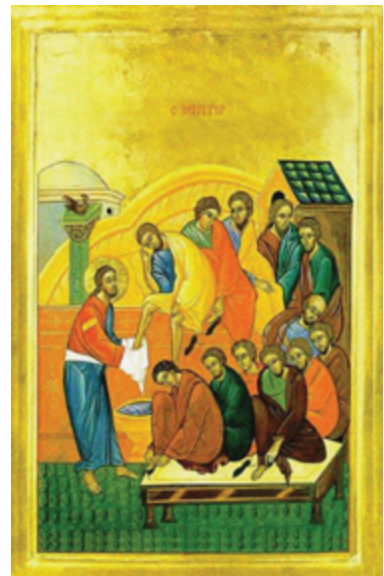
*From Archbishop Gagnon's Pastoral Letter Announcing the Synod:*

In the Church's Canon Law (c. 460) we read that the purpose of a diocesan synod is to foster the good of the entire diocesan community by calling together the clergy, religious and laity of the local church to deliberate on the pastoral needs of the diocese. Of all the institutions found in the Church to provide better governance, the diocesan synod is foremost. In a diocesan synod, which lasts several years, the bishop exercises his office of governing the church entrusted to his care. Through a consultative process, he determines the themes, questions and priorities to be discussed. In Canon Law we further learn that all those who participate in the synod, assist the bishop by freely and sincerely expressing their opinions relative to the questions under consideration. At the end of the process, the bishop determines which of the recommendations made by the Synod will be accepted and promulgated in the diocese.

Pope Francis calls a diocesan synod, an opportunity to walk together - a truly "wonderful experience where people walk and journey through history together with Our Lord who walks among us. We do not walk alone."

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### **PARISH CATECHISM CLASSES 2017-2018**

Catechism classes are held on Sunday mornings at 10:15 a.m. Those who would like their children to take part in catechism classes are asked to complete a **REGISTRATION FORM** for each child. A catechism registration fee will help defray some of the costs of running our program. Nevertheless, this requested fee should in no way be considered a reason to refrain from enrolling children for whose parents the fee would impose an undue hardship.

As a rule, each Sunday children participating in our parish catechism program gather in the parish hall with their parents/guardians by 10:15 a.m. for some initial prayers and announcements. Then children break into their various catechetical groups and proceed with their catechists to their designated classrooms. Catechetical classes are divided into the following age groups: SEEDS (Preschool), PROMISE (Kindergarten – Grade 1), GOOD NEWS (Grades 2-3), VENTURE (GRADES 4-6) and VISIONS (Grades 7-8). Parents/guardians are asked to return to the parish hall by 11:15 a.m. to be ready to pick up their children.

## LOVE IS ALL

Life is complicated, but religion doesn't have to be. If you can't recite the Ten Commandments, list the nine Choirs of Angels, explain the reason we have Octaves, name the seven Capital Sins—or the six Precepts of the Church, five books of the Pentateuch, four gospel Evangelists, three major prophets, what was made on the second day of Creation, or know why there's a partridge in the doggone pear tree at Christmastime, it's OK! The salvation of your immortal soul doesn't depend on the acquisition of a lot of information.

What it all comes down to, according to Jesus, is quite simple: Love God, and love one another. If we do that, the rest of the details take care of themselves.

That isn't to diss the catechetical ministry, upon which some of us, including me, make our bread and butter. Education is helpful in every aspect of life, and religious education enriches us for the tasks of our lives by enlarging our understanding. Learning feeds the heart and soul as well as the mind, which in turn equips us for the task of loving. It's all good.

But nobody flunks Christianity 101 by not being able to list all 20 mysteries of the Rosary on short notice. (I'm usually stuck on at least two myself, and I wrote a book about them.) Religion isn't a memory game, and the final exam, if you remember Matthew 25, doesn't include data retrieval of any kind (with regrets to your Confirmation teacher). By the time we get to Judgment Day we discover we've already handed in our work. And the work, as it happens, exclusively involves how much and in how many ways we've shared our love.

Jesus wasn't tossing a game-changer at the scholar who questioned him. The law of God was always about love, if we paid attention to the passage from Exodus—or just about any passage of the law and prophets. These "new" commandments merely summarize and abbreviate all that's gone before, Jesus says. In John's gospel, of course, Jesus further distills the teaching to one command: Love one another. He's not eliminating the obligation to love God but acknowledging that the way God wants to be loved is through demonstrations of care for each other.

We live on a small planet, as we're beginning to appreciate in this century as never before. There's no room for hate on this little world of ours, nor indifference to the plight of anyone, no matter how different or far away. How much less, then, can we afford to turn our hearts from the people closest to us: spouses, family members, fellow parishioners, neighbours, coworkers, fellow citizens, and resident noncitizens. Love is what we're here for. Let's get to work. — Alice Camille

**THE MOON HAS TWO SIDES**

The moon is a far cry from the sun in more ways than one. It is not a fiery orb that emits heat and light but a cold satellite that simply reflects the light it receives from elsewhere. That's on one side, anyway. The other side is in shadow.

That makes the moon an apt metaphor for the religious person. We don't generate truth, light, and love on our own but reflect what comes from God. Of ourselves we can do nothing. And whatever part of us fails to turn to God remains in darkness, hidden and dangerous. What happens if we make a pretense of our religious lives and do not genuinely turn any aspect of ourselves over to God? Ah, now we not only endanger ourselves but others as well. For those who are not yet religiously minded see our false emissions of truth and read them for honest ones. Now the darkness of the world becomes doubly dark.

Those who have avowed themselves as religious people—by getting baptized, going to church, going through the motions of the spiritual life, identifying in public as Catholic, even hanging the rosary from the rearview mirror—are declaring in effect: This is what it means to follow Christ. Watch me. This is how it's done. The responsibility for saying *yes, yes*, and doing *no, no*, is serious of course, as Jesus teaches elsewhere. How much more confusing is it for *highly visible* religious people—those in leadership roles—to present themselves as God's representatives and then to fail to live up to their obligations?

Today [...] it's worth considering these things. Bad religion is so much worse than no religion at all because of the damage it does, in effect, to God's reputation. The prophet Malachi declares that God will make the blessing of a bad priest into a curse for the people. Honestly, God doesn't have to. The curse is already on its way, as the last decade of suffering for the whole church has proved. The way to avert the curse and recover the blessing is to enter deeply and fervently into the spirit of humility. The humble will be exalted, Jesus promises—but let's let God do the exalting, shall we, and work on the humble part ourselves. Today's Psalm 131 is the perfect prayer for instilling the proper spirit. It's also short and easy to memorize, which makes it a portable reminder when we're tempted to arrogance. If we strive to be model moons, reflecting the glow of divine love to those around us, we'll join the ranks of the many lights who've gone before us and now wear that halo permanently.
